FAMILIES FORWARD HOUSING PROGRAM

Families Forward's Housing Program helps families with minor-aged children regain stable housing.



5.8% of – or 28,450 – Orange County students have insecure housing, more than **118%** the number 10 years ago.



In 2016-17, Families Forward received approx. 2,000 calls from families in a housing crisis. Of these calls, 58% were at risk of homelessness, and 42% were literally homeless.



In Orange County, an hourly wage of **\$27.62** is necessary to afford a one-bedroom apartment, equivalent to an annual income of \$57,440.



A minimum wage worker must work **105** hours a week to rent a one-bedroom apartment.

FAMILIES HOUSED

In 2017, Families Forward helped 203 homeless families find housing in 26 cities across Orange County. On average, families in our housing program received services for 4–5 months. Over 60% of these families had a single-mother head of household. Individualized case management, tenant assessments and career counseling were vital to each family achieving success in stable housing.



126 Homeless Families (412 children and their parents) achieved safety and stability through our Housing Program. 96% of the graduating families maintained their housing.



160 Homeless Families (585 children and their parents) achieved safety and stability through our Housing Program. 93% of the graduating families maintained their housing.



203 Homeless Families (686 children and their parents) achieved safety and stability through our Housing Program. 97% of the graduating families maintained their housing.
